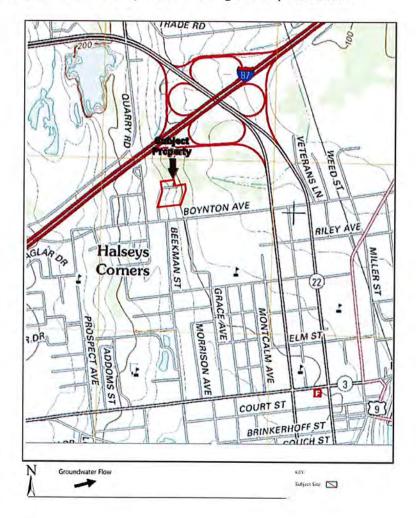
Green National is proposing the extensive rehabilitation of Beekman Towers Apartments, located at 50 Truman Ave, Plattsburgh, NY 12901, tax map ID no. 207.10-2-24. The apartment community is a Section-8 elderly high-rise with 11-stories, ~110 feet, and contains a building area of 85,252 GFA and a net rentable area (NRA) of 62,000 square feet. There are 124 units, 500 square feet each, with one bedroom and one bathroom per unit. The subject property was constructed in 1974 (46 years old) and is zoned "R-2," multifamily residential district, by the City of Plattsburgh Planning Department. The property is situated on an irregular shaped parcel containing approximately 3.00 acres with adjacent properties consisting of the following:

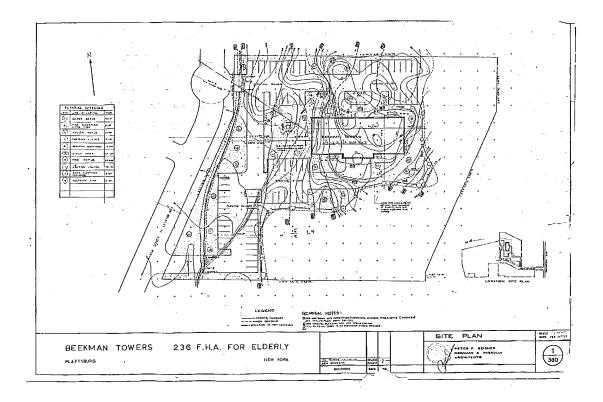
- North: Undeveloped wooded area

South: Light commercial

East: Undeveloped wooded area

- West: Asbury Lane, followed by multi- and single-family residential





Proposed Improvements

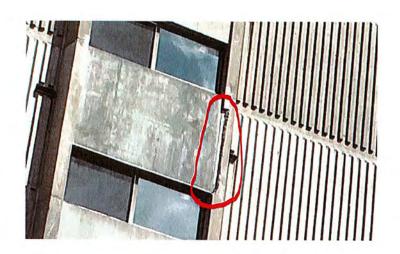
The proposed plan will include the necessary rehabilitation of the complex's exterior concrete façade along with improvements to the buildings interior. Over the past twelve months, the exterior façade has experienced significant cracks and breaks at the concrete wall at the stairwell. Some pieces have fallen to the ground posing a safety threat to the residents. The proposed improvements will address these critical repairs. Additional exterior renovations will include the sealing and striping of the entire driveway at Beekman Towers.

Interior rehabilitation will include the upgrading of every unit's kitchen, bathroom, floors and paint with the addition of enhancing the community's lighting throughout hallways and other common areas. The building was originally constructed in 1974 with no known reports of extensive interior rehabilitation. The interior renovation scope will also include the installation of new emergency pull cords in each of the resident's units.

Employment Impacts

With respect to employment impacts, in the short-terms, we are working with local architects and vendors to help design and source the materials needed for the proposed project. Green National understands the benefits of hiring local labor forces for the construction phase of the project which is scheduled to begin in June 2020 and end June 2021. We have emphasized the need for local labor and sourced materials.

In the long term aspect for local employment, there will be three to four positions created/secured to operate the community. The long-term positions made possible from this construction will be: Community Manager, one (1) Maintenance Supervisor position and one (1) Maintenance Technician. There will also be at least one part time cleaner on the community's campus. In addition to these established positions in the community, there will also be the consistent need for third party assistance throughout the lifetime of the property. These third party hires will include extermination solutions, trash removal, grounds crew, snow removal and various mechanical assistants (e.g. elevator service).

Demonstrated Need

According the U.S. Census Bureau's 2019 American Community Survey, there are 19,734 individual's living in Plattsburgh. When breaking down the city's demographic, over 14% of the population, roughly 2,762 individuals, is 65 years of age or older. There is currently a poverty rate of 24.3% meaning that roughly a quarter (¼) of all residents live below the poverty line in Plattsburgh. Additionally, there are six (6) total affordable housing communities in the Plattsburgh area but only two (2) of those communities are completely subsidized. According to the 2019 HUD Database, Beekman Towers Apartments is the only project based Section-8 affordable housing property in Plattsburgh, New York. The need for Beekman Towers is essential to the low-income elderly population. This proposal addresses improving and sustaining such housing options while extending affordability. By completing renovations estimated over \$3M in construction costs, we can preserve and enhance both the life of the asset and the lives of the residents who call Beekman Towers home.

Note to Applicant:

The 2013 New York State Budget, enacted on March 28, 2013, established new recordkeeping, reporting, and recapture requirements for industrial development agency projects that receive New York State ("NYS") sales tax exemptions, including projects granted assistance by County of Clinton Industrial Development Agency ("CCIDA").

These new NYS sales tax recording and reporting requirements for industrial development agency projects include the following requirements:

- 1. CCIDA must keep records of the amount of sales tax benefits provided to each project and make those records available to NYS upon request.
- 2. CCIDA must report to NYS, within 30 days after providing financial assistance to a particular project, the amount of sales tax benefits expected to be provided to such project.
